

Grant Agreements

Fresh Water project

GOB Menorca (Balearic Group of Ornithology and Defense of Nature) Restoration of water collection tanks and water storage facilities on working farms. Protecting the availability and quality of fresh water on the island is a key issue, and as such has been identified as a priority area of work for the MEPF to support.

Amount funded: €12,585

MAR NOSTRA project

GOB Menorca (Balearic Group of Ornithology and Defense of Nature) This is a programme designed to contribute to the marine conservation in Menorca using complementary and synergistic approaches to tackle illegal fishing, raise awareness about our seas situation and marine pollution, as well as reduce single-use plastics. Amount funded: €38,395€

Vulnerable Fish Study

OBSAM (Socio-Environmental Observatory of Menorca) With fish studies having virtually

With fish studies having virtually stopped since 2011, it is estimated that some species have decreased by up to

80%. The results from this continued study of vulnerable fish populations will then feed into a wider marine conservation strategy.

Amount funded: €18,370

Posidonia Oceanica Study

OBSAM (Socio-Environmental Observatory of Menorca)

This project supports the Balearic government by monitoring the posidonia meadows that surround Menorca. Monitoring oceanic posidonia is considered an essential activity if Menorca's wider marine conservation context is to be better understood.

Amount funded: €7,740

Renewable Energy project

Alianza Mar Blava

Alianza Mar Blava is an inter-sectoral platform whose mission is to increase the protection of the Mediterranean Sea and to advance towards a more sustainable energy system based on energy saving, efficiency and renewable energies.

Amount funded by MEPF: €2,500 (Ibiza Preservation Fund, Mallorca Preservation Fund and Marilles Foundation are also supporting)

Per La Mar Viva

This small non-profit organisation aims to raise awareness about marine plastic pollution, substantially reduce the levels of waste and liaise with the current authorities on how the current methods can be improved upon.

Amount funded: €2,326.32

'More Fish, Less Plastic' Project LEADER (Local action group for Menorca's fisheries)

The campaign 'More fish, Less Plastic' aims to reduce plastic pollution by replacing harmful plastic and polystyrene fish packaging with biodegradable materials throughout the whole supply chain of Menorca's fisheries.

They also manage the Ghost Net project, which locates and removes discarded fishing nets from the sea, as well as educating to reduce illegal fishing.

Amount funded: €83,151.56 (with BLUE Marine Fundation)
